Overview of annual goals 2022:

The objectives of the Paediatric Care Switzerland Alliance Committee in 2022 included the following topics:

Annual Goals	Degree of achievement
The regulations of the Alliance for Paediatric Care Switzerland were updated and adopted.	Fully completed.
The preliminary project HFP paediatric nursing has been constituted and initial findings and contents are available.	This was not achieved and the launch was postponed to 2023.
The fields of work of the Alliance Paediatric Nursing Switzerland have been evaluated and further steps in the strategy process derived from these.	The strategy process was continued successfully, taking into account the evaluation of the fields of work.
The back office is established and provides administrative support.	Fully completed.
The political work is further established and takes place together with the expert group on paediatric and adolescent medicine as well as with other important partners.	This could be further established and expanded.

In 2022, the work of the Alliance was characterised by challenging everyday situations due to increasing economic pressure in all fields of work and the widespread shortage of skilled workers. This required flexibility and adaptability in all areas, as well as effectiveness.

The support of the established back office helped to achieve the set goals and to secure the work processes in everyday life.

Further work on strategic orientation took place in an in-depth discussion and accentuation within the individual networks and professional societies. This also led to the participating partner organisations taking an interest in the strategy process and, on the one hand, receiving stimulation from the Alliance process for their own organisations.

On the other hand, the political work was characterised by further networking and dovetailing of the thematic areas with the national partner organisations. In the context of the covid pandemic and in the course of the Ukraine crisis, this network was used to coordinate the interests of the Alliance. A success was achieved in June 2022 with the joint presentation of the concerns of psychiatric/psychological child and youth health care. The best practice examples of care in these areas were praised and strengthened by both the representatives of the FOPH and the GDK.

Also due to the particularly demanding staffing situations in health care in all paediatric areas, the preliminary HFP project unfortunately received a significant delay. The project status has now been clarified and work has been resumed.

The jointly defined priorities of the topics to be worked on also formed the basis for the annual goals for 2023. These serve to further develop and establish the Alliance as a coordinating hub for all topics relating to paediatric care for the networks, political partners, hospitals and institutions whose mandate is to care for sick children and adolescents and their families.

The conviction of all participants of the committee was impressive and motivating regarding the importance and influence of the Alliance Paediatric Care Switzerland.

Finally, we would like to thank the childrens' hospitals and institutions on behalf of the Swiss Paediatric Nursing Alliance Committee for their very good cooperation. Only with the support of personnel, infrastructural, material or non-material resources was the Alliance Paediatric Care Switzerland able to achieve the successes of the past year.
